



Min Woo Lee Age: 26 / WA


Min Woo is this week's defending champion. Always entertaining and with a huge social media presence, Min Woo produces his best golf in the big events. He was spectacular in the Australian majors last year, winning the Australian PGA Championship and finishing third in the ISPS HANDA Australian Open. Since then, he has represented Australia at the Paris Olympics and represented the International Team for the Presidents Cup.

Cam is the captain of LIV Golf's Ripper GC and led his team to three victories this year, including at home in Australia in Adelaide and the end-of-season team's championship. The BMW Australian PGA Championship is one of four Challenger PGA Tour of Australasia events he is playing in the 2024/25 season.

Jason Day Age: 36 / QLD

It's a welcome return home for the 2024 Paris Olympian who will be trying to get his name on the Kirkwood Cup for the first time. Jason has experienced a career resurgence in the past two years, returning to the top 20 in the Official World Golf Ranking earlier this year and finishing runner-up at last year's Open Championship. A former Queensland Amateur champion, Jason has now had 18 seasons as a professional and has secured 19 worldwide victories, as well as 17 top-10 finishes in major championships.



Cameron Davis Age: 29 / NSW

A former Australian Amateur and Victorian Amateur champion, Cam's first professional victory came in 2017 when, at age 22, he stunned the golf world with a closing 64 to claim the ISPS Australian Open title at The Australian Golf Club. It was the start of the rise up the world rankings which has seen the Seattle-based Sydneysider became a regular inside the top 50. Cam is a two-time winner of the Rocket Mortgage Classic on the PGA Tour, the latest coming in June this year. Cam made his Presidents Cup debut for the International Team in 2022.

Jordan Smith Age: 32 / England

A runner-up in this year's BMW International Open in Germany, Smith counts two DP World Tour titles – the 2017 European Open and 2022 Portugal Masters – among his seven wins as a professional. His Portugal victory included two rounds of 62 in an amazing 30-under-par total. Smith also has 10 major championships on his record with a top-10 at the 2017 US PGA Championship as his career-best.

Victor Perez Age: 32 / France

Now a member of the PGA TOUR, Perez has claimed two of the biggest tournaments on the DP World Tour – the Alfred Dunhill Links Championship and Abu Dhabi HSBC Championship. He has played in all four major championships with a best of T12 at the 2023 US PGA Championship and rose to a career best of 29th in the world in 2020. Perez's PGA TOUR campaign this year featured two top-three finishes. This is his second visit to Australia as a professional.

Harry Higgs Age: 32 / USA

Making his first trip to Australia, the genial Higgs is sure to be a popular figure with the RQ crowds. His successful 2024 campaign has included two victories on the Korn Ferry Tour to help him regain his PGA TOUR card for 2025. He's come close to winning on the world's toughest tour, securing runner-up finishes at the 2019 Bermuda Championship and 2020 Safeway Open. In 2021, the "Big Rig" had his best finish at a major, finishing T4 at the 2021 US PGA Championship.



GETTING TO THE TOURNAMENT

Public Parking

Public parking is available at the car park on the eastern land of Royal Queensland Golf Club, entering off Curtin Avenue East.

Spectators can then walk directly into the venue from the car park through the main entrance.

Parking for all patrons is free of charge for the duration of the tournament.

Rideshare Station

Ride share drop off zone is at the public car park with access via Curtin Avenue East and Fison Avenue West.

Access to the Course

All patrons must enter the course at the main event entry which is located on Curtin Avenue East. Course access is available to patrons with general admission tickets, official accreditation or hospitality passes.

There will be no general admittance access via Curtin Avenue West.

Patrons are to stay outside the ropes and follow the marshal's instructions when crossing the fairways at the designated crossing points. Pass outs are not available at this event.

Gate Opening and Closing Times

Gate times are related to the tournament draw and tee times, which are confirmed closer to the event. Indicative times are as follows.

- Thursday and Friday: gates open at 5.30am and close one hour after play concludes at approximately 7.00pm
- Saturday and Sunday: gates open at approximately 5.30am and close at approximately 6.00pm**

Gates will be open to the public free of charge from 3.00pm each day.

**Weekend times are subject to change pending tee times.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Electronic super screens

Electronic super screens are located at the main entrance and 18th green, Clubhouse Village, Dabble Party Hole and Champions Village on the 17th Hole to ensure all spectators are up to date on play.

The screens will display the tournament channel feed comprising of broadcast, live scoring and partner brandina.

First Aid

First Aid is available all week adjacent to the first tee and Royal Queensland pro-shop. Please take note of the Assist First Aid location on the map and when you are near the first tee.

Daily draw sheets and maps

Daily draw sheets and course maps will be available upon entry to the course, at the merchandise marquee.

Cashless event

The event is a cashless event, and as such there is no ATM on site.

Mobile phone policy

Mobile phones may be used, however they must remain on **SILENT** at all times, and have the **FLASH OFF.**

Mobile phone photography is permitted on all tournament competition days, and video on non-competition days only. Please be considerate of tournament play and other spectators at all times.

Digital cameras

Professional Cameras and Video Cameras are strictly prohibited at the event. Only official media and accredited officials can take photographs or footage using professional camera.

Mobile phones and small digital cameras may be used, providing they are on silent.

Evacuation policy

A golf tournament can continue play in raining conditions. If weather is potentially dangerous to players and spectators, then a siren will sound and play will be suspended.

If the siren sounds, patrons are advised to seek shelter immediately and avoid the following: Open areas, hill tops and high places, isolated trees, golf carts grandstands, telephone poles, metal or wire fences, metal stakes and TV towers. If an evacuation is required, spectators will be directed to the nearest departure gates.

Prohibited items

- Push or motorized Bikes and Scooters
- No video or audio equipment, PDA's, radios, televisions
- No alcoholic beverages or glass bottles may be brought onto or taken from the grounds of the Tournament.
- Large eskies/coolers, glass or aluminum bottles, Stanley type mugs, large thermo mugs or thermoses. (Only sealed plastic bottles (nonalcoholic) or empty drinking vessels may be brought into the grounds, max capacity of 600mls)
- Crates, milk crates, stepladders or raised platforms
- Signs, banners, Visible obscene, indecent, or inappropriate clothing
- Propaganda material of a racist or xenophobic nature or constituting an incitement to violence.
 This also applies to the wearing of clothing or insignia of a racist or xenophobic nature or constituting an incitement to violence.
- Sirens, Horns, or musical instruments.
- Firearms, explosive devices, knives or cooking/picnic utensils
- Alcohol and Illegal drugs or substances
- Animals (except service animals to aid guests with disabilities)
- Any political or religious elements whatsoever, such as banners, boards, symbols or fliers
- Projectiles (e.g., Frisbees or beach balls)
- Anything (including, but not limited to, flags, flyers, banners and clothing) that would facilitate ambush marketing or other commercial activity.
- Drones, model aircraft, remotely operated camera equipment or other similar airborne devices
